Family members can view TRICARE benefits, explore eLearning opportunities, and request information from State VA offices.

Youth News and Notes

Pete MacLeod—Youth Committee Chair



2014 was a very memorable year for youth activities at Post 7589.

In March professors and students from the film club at the Woodbridge campus of Northern Virginia Community College converged on the Post headquarters to produce an excellent video on wartime experiences by Post 7589 members. Professors Bryan Brown and Chris Stallings spearheaded the project. They set up shop and interviewed veterans for several hours and their finished product was excellent and released on YouTube. Just meeting the students, some of them veterans themselves, was a great experience and the respect they showed for members of the Post had to make you feel good.

Later, in March, Quartermaster Rick Raskin announced that Royce Maynard Picot of Manassas was selected as the VFW Post 7589 Scout of the Year. He is an Eagle Scout and made an impressive presentation.

In April, Ms. Elizabeth Chung of Osbourn Park High School placed first in the Manassas area Ladies Auxiliary Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest.

In late April several of us were honored to be part of "Career Day" at Baldwin Elementary School in Manassas. It was part of an effort by the Manassas Museum to involve the entire Manassas community. We spoke to five classes. The highlight of the day for the students was an old Army

canteen! That drew more attention and interest than all of our "war stories" put together.

On an afternoon in late May about 20 Social Studies students from Stonewall Jackson High School showed up at Post Headquarters to interview comrades of Post 7589 for a class project. There were actually more than 100 students involved in the "Veterans Interview" project. The Stonewall teacher leading the project was Mr. Blake Ferreira. At least a dozen Post members took part. Many of us saw first hand the high tech wonders of today as the young students used their handheld devices to record audio and video as they interviewed us.

On Memorial Day about 30 Scouts and leaders from Pack 1355 again helped Post 7589 and the Ladies Auxiliary at ceremonies at the Manassas Veterans Memorial and later with flag placements at Manassas Cemetery.

In June, Osbourn Park High School student Cadet Cari Rozi received a VFW Bronze Junior ROTC medal from Post 7589. She is part of the Navy ROTC program at the high school.

In early September the annual Youth Yard Sale raised over \$600.00 for our Youth Awards Prize Fund. Thanks to comrades of Post 7589 and members of the Ladies Auxiliary for untold hours of "heavy lifting" and just plain "time" which is always part of any yard sale.

As part of Veterans Day week activities members of Post 7589 spoke at schools in

the Manassas area including Manassas Christian School, Mayfield Intermediate School, Round Elementary School, Haydon Elementary School and Weems Elementary School. Special thanks to Quartermaster Rick Raskin for help in producing a 20 minute video taken from my "Vietnam home movies." It was a hit with more than 200 fourth graders at both Haydon and Weems.

Again, on Veterans Day, Scouts from Manassas and Haymarket helped Post 7589 and its Ladies Auxiliary with ceremonies and flag placements.

The culmination of the Youth Activities for 2014 was the annual essay contests including Patriot's Pen (grades 6-8) and Voice of Democracy (Grades 9-12) and the VFW Citizenship Teacher of the Year competition. We had 94 teachers and students from the Manassas area taking part this year representing 9 different schools. Again, thanks to the comrades of Post 7589 and the Ladies Auxiliary for more hours of help in putting all of that together including a very successful Awards Ceremony on December 7. And a special thanks to the Post for allocating \$2,150.00 in prizes for the award recipients.

VFW Charter Change Becomes Law

The president signed the VFW's new charter into law last week. The two requested changes — replacing men with veterans, and widows with surviving spouses — was prompted by Resolution 301 passed at the VFW's 115th National Convention in July, and supported by two companion bills introduced by Senate Veterans Affairs Committee Chairman Bernie Sanders (I-Vt.) and House VA Committee Chairman Jeff Miller (R-Fla.). According to the VFW Magazine, this was the fifth charter change since the original was signed by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1936. The other four amendments were:

- 1953 – changed the “Act of Incorporation” to cover all services, since the Air Force wasn't created until 1947.
- 1995 – opened membership to those

who served in Korea or its territorial waters for 30 consecutive or 60 non-consecutive days after June 30, 1949.

- 2002 – opened membership to those who receive hostile fire or imminent danger pay.
- 2006 – added a clause noting that the VFW has “perpetual existence.”

Keep Spirit of '45 Alive

The VFW attended a kickoff ceremony at the National Press Club the week of December 15th to support “Keep the Spirit of '45 Alive” through the coming 70th anniversary of the end of World War II next August. Prescription Tracking

VA recently implemented a new tool that allows veterans to track the delivery of their VA prescriptions through My HealtheVet. This tool grants veterans the opportunity to track their medication refills online, 24/7, without having to rely on calls to their VA medical facility for status updates. Defense Bill Adds New Child Custody Protections

Included in this year's annual defense authorization bill is a new rule that prevents state judges from using military deployments against troops in child custody cases. According to Military Times, versions of the measure have passed in the House 12 times since 2007, but Senate and Pentagon objections have repeatedly sidelined the changes, primarily because military leaders wanted the states to voluntarily adopt their own regulations dealing with military custody issues. Rep. Mike Turner (R-Ohio) and former Kentucky National Guard Capt. Eva Slusher said those efforts do not account for the transient nature of military life. After waging a successful two-year fight all the way to the Kentucky Supreme Court, Slusher had pushed for a national law to prevent others from facing the same heartbreak. “This is about having peace of mind,” she said. “When you're deployed, there are so many things to deal with. Worrying about your kids shouldn't be one of them.” This action now fulfills VFW Resolution 414, passed by delegates attending the VFW's 113th National Convention, which urged Congress to prevent permanent changes to child custody arrangements while service members are deployed. World War II, Through Patton's Lens

Imagine, military historian Kevin Hymel writes, if George Washington or Ulysses S. Grant had carried a camera and photographed war as he experienced it. How important would those images be as documents of history?

Gen. George S. Patton, the brilliant but often-troublesome U.S. Army commander of World War II, did just that during his campaigns across North Africa and Europe from 1942 through 1945.

Patton, an amateur photographer who carried an Army-issued Leica camera, took hundreds of photos of the war he lived: ruined towns, dead soldiers, destroyed tanks, civilian refugees, ancient monuments, his palatial headquarters in Sicily (where, he said, all the maids gave him the fascist salute) and, sometimes, soldiers simultaneously taking pictures of Patton as he photographed them.

Those images today reside in the Library of Congress's Manuscript Division. Patton died following a car accident in Germany just months after the war ended, and in 1964 his family donated his papers – and photo albums – to the Library.

Hymel appeared at the Library on Nov. 18 to discuss the photos and his own book about them, "Patton's Photographs: War as He Saw It." The event was sponsored by the European Division.

The general, Hymel said, mailed the photos home to his wife, Beatrice, to build a historical record of his experiences.

"I'm going to send you photographs and letters so that some future historian can make a less-untrue history of me," Patton told her.

Beatrice wrote captions and placed his photos into albums along with images of the general taken by others: Patton wading ashore during the Sicily invasion; meeting with Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower; playing with his pet bull terrier, Willie; posing beside a tank in headgear of his own design – a gold football helmet bearing the stars of his rank.

"His photo albums are just like yours and mine," Hymel said. "They're photographs that we take and photographs that other people take that we like and put into our albums."

The albums also chronicle Patton's time in limbo following two infamous incidents in the Sicily campaign – he slapped soldiers suffering battle fatigue, drawing the wrath of Eisenhower and Congress. Awaiting a new assignment, Patton restlessly toured forts in Malta, pyramids in Egypt and battlefields and cemeteries in Sicily.

"A year ago, I commanded an entire corps," he wrote after visiting the 2nd Armored Division cemetery. "Today, I command barely

my self-respect."

Patton claimed one photo saved his life. The general stopped to photograph artillery in action and, seconds later, a shell landed in the path ahead – just where, Patton said, he would have been if he hadn't stopped to use his camera.

Patton took the near-miss as a sign that God was saving him for greater achievements.

"It's only a few days later," Hymel said, "that he gets the call to come to England and command Third Army for the invasion of France and the eventual invasion of Germany."
