

Veterans of Foreign Wars Department, Posts and our veterans. I understand the need for the Council and the accomplishments achieved by having the authoritative majority come face to face in one room. However, the highlights of the Council that truly touched me emotionally on several fronts were the events at the Banquet.

Firstly, I was blown away by the students' essay submissions. This was my first time participating as an essay evaluator. I was stunned yet enthralled by the foresight, patriotism, research, humanity and clarity of the content of the material provided. As most of you are aware, the VFW proudly sponsors two essay contests each year; Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen. This year's themes were "Why my vote Matters" and "Why I Honor the American Flag," respectively. Again, I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge and give a "BZ' to Junior Vice Commander and Chairman of Youth Activities, Lou Filippone and the comrades who participated in the process.

The judging process starts at the individual post, district, and department, with financial recognition at each level for the top three through each phase. Most were good/very good, and impressive. So why am I so into this. Simple. As a veteran who is often questioned or addresses issues on these very themes of this year's essays, I was moved to the core to read and hear these young individuals' understanding

and take away of the country in which they live. As each one walked to the podium and delivered their beliefs on the importance of honoring the flag or people's right to vote, it was more than to receive an award. This message is a poignant one that all of us should be adhering to; especially for those that put their lives on the line or fought alongside people of all persuasions.

These young people were fair in their admonishment of those who failed to perform necessary civic duties, and those who summarily undermined the rights of those willing to exercise that duty. They evoked the right for a peaceful protest of people considered the underclass or not even considered. Above all, each one of them clearly understood and recognized the blood, sweat, and sacrifices made to get this country to where it is; without the men and women of the United States military the stated progress might not have been possible.

My second take away was the generosity of one of Post 7589's most outstanding members. I have known this Comrade for eight going on nine years. His untiring dedication and work on behalf of the Post and VFW are unmatched. I consider him Post 7589's Renaissance Comrade; fabricating and installing locks, doors, chairs, tables or computers and ensuring the Post has operable equipment to accomplish our mission effectively. He is the Post Bingo manager and Quartermaster. Aah, yes, and serves as the Department Senior Vice Commander too. Okay, okay, I knew all that before the Banquet.

However, what I did not know was that Rick and Janet Raskin desired to put their money where their interest and efforts lie into a higher philanthropic endeavor. Sitting there listening as the Department Commander, Ken Wiseman called each awardee to the podium was no big deal,

VFW and others visit legislators about charitable gaming

January 24: State Commander Ken Wiseman, State Senior Vice Commander Rick Raskin, State Quartermaster Tom Gimble and Post 9808 Commander Ed Mann along with representatives from several other organizations visited legislators in Richmond to lobby for proposed legislation that would level the playing field between charitable gaming and unregulated gaming in the Commonwealth.

Presently charitable gaming (Bingo and Pull Tabs) is regulated by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and requires adherence to strict regulation on the number of sessions that can be held and the number of electronic pull tab machines that can be in any one location. There are no such limitations for unregulated gaming.

HB2707 and it's companion SB1527 require the Virginia Charitable Gaming Board to conduct an annual evaluation of the conduct of charitable gaming operations in Virginia. The bill also removes restrictions regarding the number of calendar days that charitable gaming may be conducted at buildings owned by nonprofit entities and raises to four the number of days that such gaming may be conducted in buildings owned by other entities.

We saw those legislators who can best impact the proposed bills and had very productive meetings. The legislation is expected to advance in the House and Senate.


Proceeds from the raffles are used to support various VFW Programs.

Mentors needed for Veterans' Docket

The Prince William County Veterans' docket was developed to give veterans who have been charged with a criminal or serious traffic offense the opportunity to seek and participate in service connected treatment or other services that address service connected issues which led to the current pending charges.

Veterans would be allowed to participate in relevant services prior to final disposition of their charges. The docket is operated on the assumption that meaningful participation in service connected treatment programs will ultimately lead to the best possible outcome of the pending charges. A mentor program staffed by veterans is being developed to help guide participants through the process.

There is a need for veterans to volunteer as mentors. The Veterans' docket is held every 4th Monday at the courthouse in

Veterans Service Organizations Issue The Independent Budget Policy Agenda for 116th Congress

VA MISSION Act implementation identified as top priority

WASHINGTON (January 17, 2019) — Today, DAV, Paralyzed Veterans of America and Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States released The Independent Budget Veterans Agenda for the 116th Congress which contains policy recommendations to ensure that the Department of Veterans Affairs remains fully-funded and capable of carrying out its mission to serve veterans and their families both now and in the future. The Independent Budget is a roadmap for the 116th Congress, the Department of Veterans Affairs and the Administration to navigate critical veteran issues. It includes detailed recommendations in the areas of benefits, health care, infrastructure, education, employment, training and memorial concerns facing veterans and their families. For over 30 years, the three partnering organizations have co-authored The Independent Budget.

The Independent Budget sets full and faithful implementation of the VA MISSION Act as the critical issue for the 116th Congress. This historic legislation supported by DAV, Paralyzed Veterans of America and VFW, along with more than 30 additional veterans service organizations, reforms the way in which veterans access care in their community, invests in VA's capacity to provide care at its health care facilities, calls for assessment and modernization of VA infrastructure, and corrects the inequity of the VA Caregiver Support Program. The groups see proper implantation of this Act as central to ensuring all enrolled veterans have timely access to quality care and that the VA health care system remains strong.

"One of our key legislative concerns is ensuring that veterans who were exposed to dangerous toxic chemicals and other environment hazards during their service receive full compensation and other earned benefits," said DAV National Commander Dennis R. Nixon. Citing Blue Water Navy veterans exposed to Agent Orange and veterans of all eras and conflicts exposed to burn pits, Nixon added, "It adds insult to serious injury to deny the long-term, adverse health effects that result from these exposures while veterans continue to suffer and die. These benefits are earned through service and it is unjust to require veterans — or their survivors — to sacrifice more after all they have already given for the nation."

Paralyzed Veterans of America focused their efforts on health care review. The organization has a unique perspective from working daily inside all VA Spinal Cord Injury and Disorder centers across the country. "It is imperative to provide veterans better comprehensive mental health care including suicide and substance abuse prevention programs," said David Zurfluh, national president of Paralyzed Veterans of America. "Veterans who are seriously ill also deserve expanded support for their caregivers," Zurfluh added.

"Ensuring veterans are able to achieve their post-military educational goals has never been more important, so the Independent Budget VSOs will hold VA and Congress accountable for the proper implementation of the Forever GI Bill," said VFW National Commander B.J. Lawrence. "We also recognize the need to perpetuate the memory of our fallen and will fight to ensure all veterans have access to memorial benefits that honor their service to America."

The Independent Budget Veterans Agenda is being delivered to VA and Congressional leaders and is now available for the public to read at <u>independentbudget.org</u>.
