VFW STATEMENT ON DISTINGUISHED WARFARE MEDAL

WASHINGTON (April 15, 2013) — The Pentagon announced today [April 15] that Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel has cancelled the creation of the Distinguished Warfare Medal, and instead will create a new device to affix to existing medals to properly recognize drone operators, cyber warriors and others who are making a tremendous real-time impact on battlefields far away.

John E. Hamilton, national commander of the 2 million-member Veterans of Foreign Wars of the U.S. and its Auxiliaries, said the right decision was made. “The VFW is appreciative of the Joint Chiefs of Staff for their review, and commends Secretary Hagel for taking this issue on so early in his tenure. This decision will clearly keep medals that can only be earned in combat in their high order of precedence, while providing proper recognition to all who support our war-fighters regardless of their distance from the fight.”

The shape of the new device, the medals it can be affixed to, plus award eligibility, are expected to be determined within the next 90 days.

**NATIONAL VFW IRAQ / AFGHANISTAN VETERANS
COMMITTEE MEETING, 3/3/13 IN ARLINGTON,
VIRGINIA**

The committee heard about the organization “Student Veterans of America” which now has more than a million members across the country with 750 chapters on college campuses. Local VFW chapters are urged to make contact with these students for potential membership and cooperation. Posts are also encouraged to help them find jobs by creating job lists in their local areas. Their website is www.studentveterans.org

VFW National Commander John Hamilton spoke to the committee and said 73 percent of these student veterans are eligible to join the VFW. He also said that surveys show 40 percent of Iraq/Afghanistan veterans know little about the new GI Bill. So information from local Posts to these young vets is invaluable. He recommended coordination with their states, which Post 7589 is already doing. He said there was also a problem with Iraq/Afghanistan veterans getting in-state tuition rates. The problem is that some of the veterans “officially” signed up in one state but have actually lived most of their lives in another. Some colleges and universities are giving veterans trouble getting in-state rates when they have lived 98 percent of their lives in one state but happened to enlist in another. This is one of the legislative points driven home to members of Congress during the legislative days on the hill from March 4-6, 2013.

Representatives of the VFW National Home in Eaton Rapids, Michigan spoke to the committee. Call 1-800-343-3200 if you would like information about the home or would like to contribute money. The home now has 6 vans and is working on obtaining a 7th. You can now obtain a life membership in support of the National Home.

Shannon Brown, national committee member in charge of recruitment, spoke and recommended sending a postcard or making a phone call or sending email to every member of the Post alerting them to upcoming meetings. She said it was a lot of work but worth it if just two or three interested members, already on the membership books, started showing up at meetings and volunteering to work. She said this was a way of retaining members and getting members, already signed up, to become active. She said this could be especially effective for young Iraq/Afghanistan veterans. She said there is nothing like the personal touch in reaching out to veterans. Show you care!

And she emphasized every VFW member should always be carrying at least one membership application with them! Brown also said that tests continue with the new VFW "Recruiter APP" for Androids and I-phones and hopefully there will be a rollout at the National Convention in Louisville this summer.

The meeting was thrown open to ideas. And I told the approximately 85 members from around the country of Post 7589's efforts in the past few years to "adopt" local units serving in Iraq and Afghanistan, putting on parties and get-togethers for families of active duty personnel and our recruitment drives at local malls and stores. We also have an ongoing project to create a Power-Point presentation about the Post and Ladies Auxiliary to show to young people. I also told of our membership brochure and additionally recommended the VFW coordinate job lists among the various Posts to give younger and older veterans a list of jobs that might be available in local areas. There could be coordination with the state employment services and the local chambers of commerce to help vets get jobs! I submitted a six page proposal which I can send to any member, just email me at jeanandpeter-macleod@verizon.net

Ideas from other posts on recruiting Iraq/Afghanistan veterans:

Job Fair combined with a fun/family day either at the Post or a

neutral location. Get local businesses to take part, perhaps state employment agency, local colleges, and organizations. Email or snail-mail Post members to alert them. Make personal phone calls to get people to turn out.

Sponsor a touring basketball or softball team to make an appearance in a local community and combine with a family fun fair.

Set up a local food pantry at the Post to serve the entire community but can also serve veterans and veterans and active duty families in need along with the homeless.

Shannon Brown suggested a “listening” approach to recruiting. Listen to younger (and older) vets. What are they looking for? What would help them? What would make them want to become active in the Post? Talk to veterans about the long term advantages of VFW membership and about the many activities at not-for-profit organizations like the VFW. Brown said we should “sponsor” a member that we sign up. Make sure he or she gets to that first meeting. She recommended we call every member of the Post at least twice a year. She said emails are too easy to ignore.

She also recommended getting involved with a local USO. Most of these guys and gals served by the USO are going to become veterans someday and the USOs, (especially in the DC area) can use the help. A win-win situation! She said just providing a meal on a Friday night at a USO can win a VFW Post dozens of friends and potential members.

Update on the “virtual” VFW Post in Texas: Now have 450 members statewide. Technical kinks are still being worked out. But in a big state like Texas, where some members live 100 miles or more from the nearest Post, it is working. It is based in Austin and still being monitored by the national VFW.

Our next meeting of the National Iraq/Afghanistan Veterans Committee is set for Louisville at the National Convention this summer.
