We ended the period with a record 102 percent in recruitment (no small feat). We completed Buddy Poppy distribution on 5/27/23 (our biggest to date) with barely four people juggling other commitments. Not everyone can routinely participate but surely the three times a year when participation is crucial we can and must do better.

In closing, I will shamelessly ask for your continued support for the 2023-2024 year. Remember recruiting is an all-hands effort. However, more importantly, the numbers give us the power to demand what we earned and hold Washington from taking away the little we do have. Lip service without action means nothing. Let's keep the pressure on, lest they forget.

Youth Committee Update

The Youth Committee hopes all our members are having a happy and healthy spring. We held our last meeting on 18 May at the Post. The meeting was attended by Comrades Alex and Tina Bliem, Erika Laos, Auxiliary President Mary Corkhill and me. Comrade Peter MacLeod participated by conference call. The first issue discussed was the condition of the Post sign. As you may recall, last year an Eagle Scout

candidate from our Post was supposed to replace the sign, but the project got bogged down with the City of Manassas in the permit process. The project was then changed to a sign restoration, but unfortunately the Scout left the Troop to focus on his senior year activities at school. The sign is currently in a state of disrepair and poorly represents our Post to both the public and to prospective members. It is exhibiting signs of rotting wood and peeling paint. The VFW decal is separating and coiling up into a scroll. We revisited this project, and it was decided to have some of the adult leaders from Troop 1372 try to stabilize the sign with wood filler, paint and a new set of decals. We were thinking it could be done on some weekend or weekday afternoon. This would hold us until the sign could be replaced at a later date. We'll have more information on this project as it develops. If anyone is interested in helping with this project, just let us know. Another Scout project that came up was the storage shed behind the Post. It needs some painting, and we discussed the possibility of letting our Scout Troop take this job on.

Our essay contest programs were discussed at length and involved closure of last year's campaign and the startup of the 2023 program. With regards to last year, we had a few loose ends to take care of involving runner up certificates for a small number of Patriot's Pen and Voice of Democracy students. - 16 May 2023 we presented SMSgt Aleena Owens the NCO Award and C/Lt Col Chris Pewett with the Officer Award at the Civil Air Patrol meeting.

We, as a committee, vote on the merit of each request and if approved arrange for funding through Past State Commander / Post Quartermaster Rick Raskin. A few requests came up and were voted on. Comrade Paul Chase and his goodwill lives on, and he would be proud to see the young lives he is changing with his generosity. Alex and Tina were discussing the upcoming Scouting activities and camps scheduled for this summer. It looks like they are going to have a very busy season with the Scouts. I'll let them discuss the details in their Scouting report. The 6 May Flag Retirement Ceremony was another resounding success with great attendance and participation and cooperative weather. 7 VFW members, 4 Auxiliary members, 15 BSA, 11 Troop Leaders and 2 Cub Scouts attended. Scouts from Pack 1355, 1372 B&G and Crew 1372 were present. A big thank you goes out to all who participated especially to comrades Alex and Tina Bliem, Past State Commander Rick Raskin, Commander Wayne Moore, Chaplain Ron Knowles and comrades Peter MacLeod and Kelly Williams, Auxiliary President Mary Corkhill, Auxiliary members Janet Raskin, Yvonne Sullivan and Joey Bliem and the adult leaders of Troop 1372. JLC Report

An informal after-action meeting was held at Post 9808 on April 14. At that time the outcome of the proposals offered to the legislature were evaluated and a roadmap going forward discussed.

The JLC met formally at the Virginia War Memorial on May 9. The agenda included a wrap up of last year's legislative session (4 wins) and the prospect of reintroducing JLC 2023-02 and JLC 2023-03 for the next session.

2023 Joint Leadership Council Legislative Initiatives Status

JLC 2023-01 Constitutional amendment; property tax exemption for certain surviving spouses. Constitutional amendment. Signed by the Governor, Will be reintroduced in 2024 Session, and if passed and signed will require a referendum in the 2024 General Election.

JLC 2023-04 Military spouses; burial fees. Signed by the Governor and becomes effective 1 July 2023.

JLC 2023-05 Virginia National Guard Passport established; free entry and parking. Signed by the Governor and becomes effective 1 July 2023.

JLC 2023-06 Income tax subtraction; National Guard. Increases from \$3,000 to \$5,500 the income tax subtraction for wages or salaries. Also expands the military ranks that qualify to 06 and below: Signed by the Governor and will be effective for calendar year 2023.

JLC 2023-02 Real property tax; exemption for disabled veterans and surviving spouses. Provides that a person who is eligible for the real property tax exemption for certain disabled veterans and surviving spouses is entitled to a refund, retroactive to his date of eligibility, of taxes paid during the period of exemption, excluding interest or penalties. Under the bill, the refund is exempt from the statute of limitations for applications for correction of an assessment. Currently not included in the General Assembly Budget.

JLC 2023-03 Income tax, state; military benefits subtraction, age restriction. Income tax; military benefits subtraction; age restriction. Removes the age 55 or older restriction on those individuals allowed a military benefits income tax subtraction beginning with taxable year. Currently not included in the General Assembly Budget.

Charitable Gaming

I spoke on the issues with charitable gaming in the Commonwealth and shared the VFW position paper drafted by PSC Tom Gimble, Past CIC Hal Roesch, and myself. Legislative chair Monti Zimmerman and I previously had a Zoom meeting with Senator Bryce Reeves who is working the gaming issues. There is a plan to address the issues through a working group of state legislators and hopefully arrive at an acceptable solution without involving the next legislative session or the JLC. Should an acceptable solution not be reached I will modify our position paper accordingly and introduce a JLC initiative for which Senator Reeves agreed to be a patron. I have wide support within the JLC and do not foresee any issues getting approval for an initiative if needed.

Department of Veteran Services Report

DVS Commissioner Daniel Gade gave an update on several items:

A Virginia is for Veterans logo has been approved.
\$5M has been allocated for suicide prevention.
Data has been obtained to support the outreach program.
A woman's Veteran license plate is in the design phase should be available in the fall.

The DVS has updated performance measurements. The Puller Veterans Facility at Vint Hill has construction

delays – hopefully opening in November.

Department of Military Affairs Report

Major General Timothy Williams, the Adjutant General of Virginia, reported 50 National Guard members will be deployed to Eastern Europe to establish brigade operations which potentially could grow to 4300 soldiers.

MG Williams also is grateful that the JLC has been instrumental in National Guard support.

MG Williams is retiring in June and his successor will be Brigadier General Jim Ring.

JLC Chair Denise Williams presented MG Williams with a plaque honoring his service.

JLC Organization

Legislative Chair John Clickener, Marine Corps League stepped down for health reasons. Glenn Yarborough, AUSA was appointed interim chair.

The next JLC meeting will be July 13 at the Virginia War Memorial.
