Independence By Choice, Earned by Sacrifice

Comrades,

As the Republic embarks on its' 246th celebration of Independence Day, I want to extend my best wishes to all, especially to the service men and women who made the sacrifice and the families that understand

the price paid for a continued free America.

The week before the festivities we find ourselves purchasing food, drinks, American Flags, or a tee-shirt with a patriotic saying or emblem. I smile when reading the "Freedom isn't Free" slogan! It sounds good but to many, it is a quaint point often missed.

The Founding Fathers' hope of democracy warranted this day as one for celebration. However, amid the turmoil and unhinged activities, it is difficult to drink a beer and believe things will be better when we sober up. The Fourth of July – also known as Independence Day or July 4th – has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941. The tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American

Revolution. On July 2nd, 1776, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later delegates from the 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence, a historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson. From 1776 to the present day, July 4th had been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues. The Fourth of July 2022 is on Monday.

The Department of Virginia has a new President as of June 11th when the first male was elected and sworn into the office. President Fred Jennings will be traveling the state during the coming months to meet and greet the members of the Department.

The National Convention is in Kansas City, MO from July 16 - 22. The incoming National President, Jane Reape, will hold her Celebration (Homecoming) on July 22, following the convention. Another event will be the 10th Celebrating America's Freedom Event (CAFÉ) Flight 93 National Memorial on September 10 in Somerset County, PA. It would be a great time to visit that Memorial.

The VFW Post 637, 1400 Lynchburg St. Hopewell, VA, will host the Department Auxiliary School of Instruction on August 6, at 9:00 AM. The 8th District meeting will be August 20th in King George Post 12202, 12266 Kent Road. The joint meeting will start at 10:00 AM with the Auxiliary meeting after the joint session.

The Voice of Democracy contest ("Why is the Veteran Important?") and Patriot's Pen Essay Contest ("My Pledge to Our Veterans.") are now being promoted. If you need more information, PLEASE contact any VFW or Auxiliary member.

Both contests, as well as the Teacher of the Year Program, offer scholarships and other awards. The deadline for all three contests at the Post level is 31 October 2022. Please help us recruit students, teachers and schools for these wonderful educational award programs sponsored by the VFW.

We hope you all have an enjoyable and safe 4th of July season this year no matter where you celebrate it. Please join us for our next Youth Committee meeting and make all our youth activities even more successful and rewarding. It is scheduled for Thursday, 21 July at the Post at 7:00 PM. Vet Legislation Progress

On Tuesday, June 7, 2022, President Biden signed the following nine bills into law related to veterans and the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

- S. 1760, which designates the community-based outpatient clinic of the Department of Veterans Affairs planned to be built in Oahu, Hawaii, as the Daniel Kahikina Akaka Department of Veterans Affairs Community-Based Outpatient Clinic;
- S. 1872, the “United States Army Rangers Veterans of World War II Congressional Gold Medal Act,” which provides for the award of a Congressional Gold Medal to the United States Army Rangers Veterans of World War II, in recognition of their dedicated service during World War II;
- S. 2102, the “Dr. Kate Hendricks Thomas Supporting Expanded Review for Veterans In Combat Environments Act” or the “Dr. Kate Hendricks Thomas SERVICE Act,” which expand eligibility for VA mammography screening to veterans who served in locations associated with toxic exposures;
- S. 2514, which renames the Provo Veterans Center in Orem, Utah, as the Col. Gail S. Halvorsen “Candy Bomber” Veterans Center;
- S. 2533, the “Making Advances in Mammography and Medical Options for Veterans Act,” which makes a number of changes to VA’s mammography screening and access to related medical care;
- S. 2687, the “Strengthening Oversight for Veterans Act of 2021,” which temporarily authorizes the Department of Veterans Affairs’ Office of Inspector General to issue subpoenas in certain circumstances;
- S. 3527, which authorizes VA to transfer to another property the name of a VA property that was named in statute;
- S. 4089, the “Veterans Rapid Retraining Assistance Program Restoration and Recovery Act of 2022,” which restores entitlement to educational assistance under the Veterans Rapid Retraining Program under certain conditions; Thank you to Senator Durbin and Representatives Danny Davis and Underwood for their leadership; and
- S. 4119, the “RECA Extension Act of 2022,” which extends by two years the availability of compensation for radiation exposure related to nuclear weapons development.

Senate Passes the PACT Act

The newly titled *Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act of 2022*, known as the *Honoring our PACT Act*, passed the Senate with an 84–14 vote. “This is an enormous victory for veterans, service members, and their families,” said VFW National Commander Matthew “Fritz” Mihelcic. “I commend every senator who voted in favor for those who have borne the burden of toxic exposure, for the military families struggling to care for them, and for the military men and women who will face toxic exposure in the future. This was more than a vote for expanded health care and benefits. This was about honoring our promise to care for those who swore an oath to defend our nation and our way of life.” The Senate-amended PACT Act must now go back to the House for a vote before it can be sent to the president for signature. The VFW thanks all the advocates from around the country who reached out to their senators urging them to support this historic legislation.

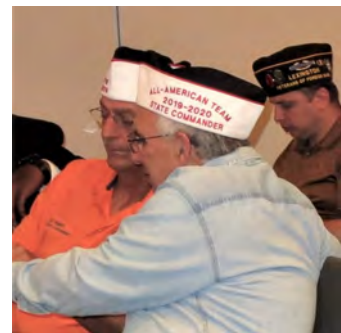

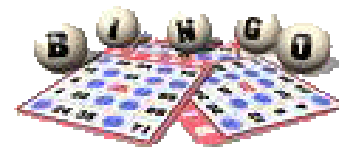

Colin J. Wolfe, the son of Amy and Mark Wolfe, grew up dancing with the Manassas Ballet Theatre, performing each year through 2005. In June 2005, Colin enlisted with the Marine Corps, graduating in September 2005. Colin was deployed to Iraq in July, 2006. He was killed by a roadside bomb only seven weeks later on August 30, 2006.

Our mission is to enhance the quality of life in Northern Virginia by providing accessible and affordable professional ballet performances, educational outreach to the community and the highest level of training to the serious student.



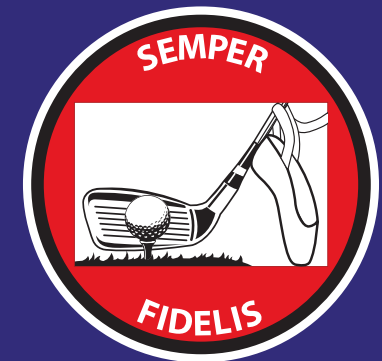
Our Educational Outreach

The Educational Outreach program is a partnership of Manassas Ballet Theatre, Prince William County Schools, the Manassas City Public Schools, SPARK (the PWC Schools Education Foundation), and the Hylton Performing Arts Center. These professional ballet programs are staged exclusively for the students during school hours and are free of charge to the students. The selected classes first watch an introductory video, which explains about the Hylton Performing Arts Center, Manassas Ballet Theatre, the process of putting a ballet performance together, and how to be a properly behaved audience member. On the day of the performance, the children are transported to the Hylton where they watch a professional ballet production at a world class venue. At the end of every performance, there is a Q & A session when the students directly interact with the MBT performers and artistic staff. After returning to school, the teachers incorporate elements of the performance experience into the SOL curriculum. In this way, over 7,000 school children annually receive exposure to a professional arts event that otherwise few would experience.
