## Hanukkah & Thanksgiving coincide for the first and only time

Hanukkah will be on Thanksgiving that while presently Hanukkah can be this year, for the first time ever.

Thanksgiving is set as the fourth nukkah will ever overlap with Thanks-Thursday in November, meaning the latest it can be is 11/28. 11/28 is also the earliest Hanukkah can be.

The Jewish calendar repeats on a 19 year cycle, and Thanksgiving repeats on a 7 year cycle. You would therefore expect them to coincide roughly every 19x7 = 133 years.
