Commander's Message



VETERANS DAY RECOGNITION OF THE MEN and WOMEN WHO SERVED in the ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES

Another year draws to an end as we pay tribute to those women and men who served. Post comrades are going through the ceremonial paces of honoring all past and present. As time rolled on through the year we may have experienced

changes in our health, loss of a loved one or friend. My experiences caused me to reflect more distinctly on the type of legacy I leave my children and grandchildren.

In October 2006, I joined 6/9 Cav at Forward Operation Base (FOB) Normandy, Iraq. Shortly thereafter I began receiving Care Packages from a women's group in Anna, Illinois. The 15 or so ladies, ranging in age from their 40s to mid-80s, bestowed a kindness that was unimaginable from people who I'd never met or had very little in common with.

Upon receiving the second surprise package I decided to respond to express my appreciation and satisfy my desire to know "why me"? I learned that my predecessor was a Navy Lieutenant from that city and had passed on my name, so I received the gratuities that had previously been extended to him.

Half-way through my tour I began having problems with my breathing and decide to take Rest and Recuperation in the United States to evaluate the problem. Before returning to Iraq I decided to make a surprise trip to Anna, Ill, a quaint old town still reminiscent of the '40s &'50s. I met the lead lady whose job it was to ensure my packages arrived on time, and she quickly gathered the rest of the ladies. I took them to lunch, enjoying every minute of the 2 hours we shared. I remember one lady stating that while living in Anna her entire life, she'd only known of one colored family living there. Yes, it was obviously surprising to all to lay eyes on me,

We seem to have won over each other and my packages and correspondence continued regularly. Below is a letter sent to me by one of the ladies who asked that I share it with the unit.

In a young child's eyes "heroes" generally meant one who saves or protects. In school we were taught it also means someone you look up to or admire. Today, in my grown-up eyes, it means all this and so much more.

"Heroes" is a word many of my friends in the service do not want to be called. Those who haven't fought in conflicts and have remained stateside define "heroes" as those who have actually been in theatre and fought. Ask those of my military friends who have been in the war zones and they'll define "heroes" as the ones who paid the ultimate price for freedom - those who gave their lives

I agree with all these definitions.

My thoughts also go to those who've been wounded in service to our nation - and I think of them as heroes also. Many of them will continue to fight for years to come - constantly battling to regain mobility or even simple thought processes. Some will battle the emotional scars of battle. In my grown-up eyes, these brave men and women are also heroes. Often, after the initial wave of concern from their friends and family, they are long forgotten.

So today, as I say a special prayer remembering my grandfather and his service along with the many others who served their country and have since passed on, I also say a special prayer to all those who have given their full measure and now stand on eternal patrol - our fallen heroes. If it were not for these brave men and women, who have laid down their lives in service to their nation, this nation might not have sustained the foundations upon which it was built. I have so much to be thankful for to the men and women in uniform.

Today I also honor all those who have served (and perhaps fought or are fighting in war zones) in uniform. I have so much I want to share with each of you. Many of you want to make me believe that your supportive role there is of little value. Yet without you, those who are on the front lines couldn't accomplish all that they are doing. Every job code and duty assignment are as vital as the next. We don't have the comic strip superhero who comes to save the day - we only have each other. We must rely on each person to carry out their orders to the best of their ability if we are to succeed. So, I thank you - each of you for wearing your uniform with pride. For being willing to go to foreign shores (whether called upon or not), that our homeland might be spared from the sights and sounds of war. Thank you for continuing the battle to preserve the freedoms so many have shed blood and given their lives for. For giving hope to our children. For bringing hope to many who never knew hope before. To my World War II, Korean, Vietnam, Gulf War, OEF, and OIF Veteran friends - Thank you.

Then there are my wounded heroes - from wars and conflicts past and present, from injuries sustained in the line of duty or while serving your country - my heart is with each of you. Some of your injuries have been relatively minor, some have lost arms and legs or even worse. All of you have fought to live in those first precious hours after your injuries. You have had to fight the battle within your own self - the battle to overcome your injuries. Many of you continue even today to receive therapy (physical and emotional) and may always have a need for it. Some of you may wonder why after all this time - why should you continue to fight. You fight for that daily strength, for that inner peace, for that first sign of progress, for that first step with your new leg - you do this because it is who you are. You are fighters, survivors. You are a member of the United States Armed Forces - Army, Navy, Marine, Air Force, Coast Guard, National Guard, Reserves. You are my hope. You must never give up. You are always in my thoughts and prayers. If you EVER need a pep talk, I am always an e-mail or a phone call away - it doesn't matter if it is 2 in the afternoon or 2 in the morning. A few words of support are the least I can do for you in return for all you have done for me. Thank you. Please know in the depths of your being - you are not forgotten.



Past Commander in Chief Glen Gardner to speak at Winter Council of Administration



Commander-in-Chief William "Doc" Schmitz has designated Past Commander-in-Chief Glen M. Gardner, Jr., to represent the national organization at your Department Winter Council of Administration meeting and Awards Banquet, January 10-12, 2020, in Portsmouth, Virginia.

Glen Gardner was elected commander-in-chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars on August 21, 2008, at the 109th

VFW National Convention in Orlando, Fla.

Glen served in the U. S. Marine Corps from 1966 to 1970. He served as an aircraft mechanic with the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, Marine Aircraft Group 12 in Chu Lai, Vietnam, 1968 to 1969. He was awarded the Combat Action Ribbon, Vietnam Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal with device and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry.

In 1969, Glen joined VFW Post 2993 in Olathe, Kan. Later, when he moved to Texas, Glen joined Post 3359 in Garland where he maintains his Gold Legacy Life membership. He was elected Post commander in 1977 and again in 1983, and served as Post quartermaster for five terms. He earned the title of All-American District commander in 1981-1982. Glen served as the adjutant/quartermaster for the Department of Texas, 1984-2006. Glen has served on several national committees, including the National By-Law Review committee for 19 years and as chairman of the Budget and Finance committee.

Glen and his wife, Jean, reside in Round Rock, Texas. They have three children (one deceased), four grandchildren, and one great-grandchild.

Legislative Update

The main legislative issues are as follows:
1) The President has signed a Continuing Resolution guaranteeing continued government operation through November 21st. The Senate still has not passed any appropriation bills. The House has passed 12 of the 14.

2) The senate voted 94 to 0 to approve separate legislation for the SBP/DIC to be broken apart for widowed members of military service members. It is also still in

the House version of the 2022 National Defense Authorization Act that is still in conference.

3) There is still movement to create a study before the DoD reduces medical staff arbitrarily by 18%,

Major US Army Policy Change affecting Arlington National Cemetery (ANC). ANC has put out proposed rules to change burial. If no significant opposition occurs through the Federal Register, the rules will go into effect in 90 day.

Under the latest proposal, 1,000 grave sites would be set aside for current and future Medal of Honor recipients, to ensure space is reserved for those recipients of the highest military honor. In addition to them, below-ground burials would be restricted to these other military groups:

- Troops killed in action, to include repatriated remains
- Purple Heart recipients
- Award recipients of the Silver Star or a higher honor
- Combat-related service deaths "while conducting uniquely military activities"
- Former prisoners of war
- Veterans with combat service who "made significant contributions to the nation's security" in other government posts
- Former presidents and vice presidents of the United States

Spouses of eligible individuals would also be allowed burial at their loved-ones plots.

Above-ground inurnment of ashes will be open to any veterans from World War II, military retirees, veterans who served in combat and spent at least two years in the ranks, and veterans without any combat service who "made significant contributions to the nation's security" in other government posts.

Currently, any military retiree is eligible for below-ground burial at the site, and any veteran who left the service under honorable conditions is eligible for inurnment of ashes. The former group would only be eligible for inurnment now, while many of the later would not be eligible for any admission to Arlington.



Left for Dead at Nijmegen: The True Story of an American Paratrooper in World War II

Marcus Nannini's Left for Dead at Nijmegen recalls the largerthan-life experiences of an American paratrooper, Gene Metcalfe, who served in the 82nd Airborne during WWII. As part of Operation Market Garden, Metcalfe was to be among the first to jump into what should have been a meadow, free of German troops. Instead, it was defended by three German antiaircraft cannon emplacements. Metcalf was listed as KIA and left for dead by his patrol but survived his wounds as a POW outside Munich. Metcalfe will join Nannini in conversation and provide a first-hand account of his war experiences. A book signing follows the program.

Disabled veterans eligible for free National Park Service lifetime access pass

Good for entry into 400+ National Parks and over 2000 recreation sites across the country

Spring flowers are blooming, the summer travel season quickly approaches and veterans are joining the 330-million yearly visitors enjoying U.S. National Parks.

Many veterans, with a service connected disability rating, are entering Federal parks for free with the <u>Lifetime National Parks Access Pass</u> from the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service. Good for entry into 400+ National Parks and over 2,000 recreation sites across the country, the Lifetime Access Pass is another way a grateful nation says thank you for the service and sacrifices of veterans with disabilities.

The <u>Access Pass</u> admits disabled veterans and any passengers in their vehicle (non-commercial) at per-vehicle fee areas; and, the pass owner plus three additional adults where per-person fees are charged. In addition to free entry at participating parks, the Access Pass includes discounts on <u>expanded amenity fees</u>; such as camping, swimming, boat launching and guided tours.

Veterans who have a VA disability rating, (10 percent or higher) are eligible for the Lifetime Access Pass—with two ways to apply.



First, disabled veterans can apply in person at a participating federal recreation site. Simply present photo identification (Driver's license, State ID, Passport) and documentation proving a permanent disability (VA awards letter, VA ID with service connected annotation, VA summary of benefits, or receipt of Social Security disability income). That's It. The Pass is free and issued at the time of entry.

Second, if applying by mail, send a completed packet and \$10 processing fee to the United States Geological Survey (USGS). The packet should include:

- The Access Pass application form
- Proof of residency
- VA disability award letter, VA summary of benefits, or proof of SSDI income

Pass delivery expected 10-12 weeks after receipt.

Make sure to have photo ID available when

using your Lifetime Access Pass and enjoy the majestic scenery and abundant recreational opportunities our National Parks provide.
