PRECURSOR TO THE NAVY SEALS

The Navy Seals did not come into being until January 1962. However, as much as 20 years earlier the need for that particular skillset existed and enhanced warfare during WWII. The intent was to create an elite agency with units created for conducting guerrilla warfare as well as collecting and sabotaging intelligence

behind enemy lines.

Maritime Unit (Frogman)

The Maritime Unit's mission was to infiltrate agents and supply resistance groups by sea, conduct maritime sabotage, and to develop specialized maritime surface and subsurface equipment and devices. The Maritime Unit (MU) grew out of the Special Operations (SO) aquatic training requirement when it became apparent that the Office of Strategic Services (OSS) needed a specialized amphibious capability. Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Navy, and Army personnel helped MU pioneer special operations maritime capability.

The Maritime Unit operated in several theaters. In the Mediterranean, a fleet of hired Greek wooden fishing vessels—called *caiques*—covertly supported OSS agents in Albania, Greece, and Yugoslavia. After Italy surrendered, the MU and the San Marco battalion, an elite Italian special operations naval unit, operated against the Germans. In the Far East, the MU operated in conjunction with an Operational Group to attack Japanese forces on the Arakan coast of Burma. They jointly conducted reconnaissance missions on the Japanese-held coast, sometimes penetrating several miles up enemy-controlled rivers.

The MU was a special operations pioneer. In addition to being an early maritime warfare force, it developed or used several innovative devices, including an inflatable surfboard, a two-man kayak, and limpet mines that attached to the hull of a ship. Dr. Christian J. Lambertsen, then a U.S. Army captain, developed the Lambertsen Rebreathing Unit (LARU), an early underwater breathing device. The Lambertsen unit permitted a swimmer to remain underwater for several hours and to approach targets undetected because the LARU did not emit telltale air bubbles. The LARU was later refined, adapted, and the technology used by the U.S. Army, U.S. Navy, and NASA. The Army Special Forces Underwater Operations School at Key West, Florida, the home of Special Forces maritime operations, draws its roots from the Maritime Unit. Dr. Christian Lambersten is remembered today as the 'Father of Military Underwater Operations.'

Legislative Update



The JLC met in October and created the 2021 priority list. The options for when and how we address Richmond storming will be decided at the end of the first week in December.

The priority items in order are as follow:

JLC 2021-01 Income Tax Subtraction for Certain Low-Income Disabled Veterans (same issue from last year)

JLC 2021-02 Tax Credits for Employers Who Hire National Guard and Reserves (same issue from last

JLC 2021-03 Expand Tax Relief for Surviving Spouses of Military Services Members "Killed in Action" to also include "Died on Active Duty" (This issue will require a ballot initiative and will bring the "missing group" of surviving spouses in line with the benefits from those Killed in Action).

JLC 2021-04 Disabled Veteran State Park Passport (expands the benefit to all with a VA disability who are enrolled in the VHA and have a VHA ID card).

JLC 2021-05 Free entry to state parks for Guard members (as stated).

JLC 2021-06 No cost license plates for Guard members (for one

JLC 2021-07 Partial State Tax Exemption for Military Retirement Income (the actual benefit is very small, \$1,250 off of state taxable income for those under age 65; \$2,500 for those over age 65, but it gets a benefit on the books, moving Virginia from one of seven states with no comparable benefit).

Please vote YES on ballot initiative #2 to give property tax exemptions on one vehicle for veterans who are 100% disabled according to VA.

It is a multi-year process to get this adopted but the process stops if this initiative does not pass. The VFW has endorsed this as part of the Joint Leadership Council of Veterans Service Organizations.

The average veteran impacted by this has just one or two vehicles and lives with a spouse or family member who works. This would be a significant relief to those veterans and their families. In fact, this tax break may help more than the similar tax break for veterans with a home, as many veterans rent or live with family. This vehicle tax break applies to them as well.


The Scouts and leadership are very grateful for the use of the Post grounds to hold these functions.



We are very excited to announce that the National Museum of the United States Army will open its doors on **November 11**, 2020.

Free timed-tickets are now available through the Museum's website at <u>theNMUSA.org</u>. These tickets will be required for entry and we expect them to be in high demand.

Threatening phone scams are targeting parents and immigrants

Division of Consumer and Business Education, FTC Two disturbing phone scams have popped up on the FTC's radar. Both scams have one thing in common: they want to trick (and scare) you out of money. If you live on Staten Island, pay close attention, since these two scams seem to be targeting people in your area. But we know that scammers don't often stick with one area, so they could expand their target area any time now.

Phone scam extorting parents

This scam starts with someone texting you a picture of your own child — that they could've grabbed off of the internet, like your public social media account. Sometimes, these scammers also send frightening pictures, like images of dismembered bodies. In either case, the messages come with the threat that the scammer knows where you live and will kill your family if you don't pay them. If you get a call like this, report it to your local police right away, before you do anything else.

Phone scam targeting immigrant

This scam starts as an <u>imposter call</u> from someone pretending to be from U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). These scammers often say your immigration status is being revoked, and the police are on their way to arrest or deport you — unless you pay them money right away.

These are both scams. As scary as they seem, if you've gotten these kinds of messages or calls:

• Don't respond to calls or texts, and don't pay, even in the face of threats. Scammers will often try to pressure and intimidate you to get your money or information.

Report these scams to your local police department, and then tell the FTC at ftc.gov/complaint.

• Set your social media accounts to private. This can keep scammers from getting personal details, or grabbing pictures you don't want shared.

Know that the government will never call or text to threaten you or ask for money. If you're concerned, look up the agency's real number and call them directly. Ask them what the story is. For more tips, check out this video: https://www.youtube.com/ watch?reload=9&v=JxSiwVvwoeA&feature=youtu.be

Fees at national parks waived for veterans, Gold Star families starting next month

Starting next month, veterans and Gold Star families will be able to visit national parks and other public lands for free, under a new initiative from the Department of the Interior announced on Wednesday.

Active-duty service members and their families are already granted free access to those sites under existing department rules. The new announcement broadens that benefit to more than 20 million more individuals in recognition of their service and sacrifice on behalf of the country.

In a statement, Interior Secretary David Bernhardt said the move gives all veterans "free access to the iconic and treasured lands they fought to protect." The policy goes into effect starting on Veterans Day, Nov. 11.

Bernhardt and other federal officials made the announcement during a ceremony at the Iowa Gold Star Museum, which focuses on the history of the state's veterans and their families.

"Our veterans and Gold Star Families have made incredible sacrifices to defend our freedoms and our homeland," Sen. Chuck Grassley, R-Iowa, said in a statement. "Ensuring that they are able to enjoy all of the natural wonders of the country that they've served is one small way of saying thank you."

The policy includes admittance to well-known sites like Yellowstone National Park in Wyoming, Mount Rushmore in South Dakota, Grand Canyon National Park in Arizona and Shenandoah National Park in Virginia.

Interior officials did not provide cost estimates for the move, but said that the policy change will affect about 2,000 public locations across the country. Fees for the sites can range from a few dollars per person to nearly \$100 for some weekly and annual passes.

For free access to the sites, veterans will have to present a Department of Defense Identification Card, a Veteran Health Identification Card, a government-issued Veteran ID Card or a state-issued U.S. driver's license or identification card confirming an individual's status as a veteran.

Gold Star family members can use similar Defense Department identification cards to verify their status.

National parks officials already run promotions throughout the year to offer free admission to all visitors on certain holidays, including Veterans Day.

While most national parks sites have remained open or reopened in recent months amid the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, some programs and facilities still have limited access. Parks officials encourage all visitors to check with local parks administrators before traveling to the sites to ensure safe visits. Bernhardt also announced Wednesday plans to waives entrance fees to national parks, wildlife refuges and other public lands for all 5th grade students and their families from now until Aug. 31, 2021. The move was made because many families may not have been able to take advantage of the department's Every Kid Outdoors Annual 4th Grade Pass program because of pandemic precautions earlier this year.


