NAVY ACHIEVEMENT MEDAL AWARDED

On May 30, 2008, U.S. Navy Petty Officer 2d Class James MacLeod, a member of VFW Post 7589, was awarded the Navy Achievement Medal in a ceremony on the flight deck of the U.S.S. Dubuque in the South China Sea. MacLeod was given the medal for his actions in March of 2007 leading a "watch team" which was guarding an oil platform in the Persian Gulf. Captain Bruce H. VIRGINIA MILITARY SURVIVORS AND DEPENDENTS EDUCATION PROGRAM

The Military Survivors and Dependents Program (MSDEP) provides educations benefits to spouses and children of military service members killed, missing in action, taken prisoner, or who became at least 90 percent disabled as a result of military service in an armed conflict. Military service includes service in the United States Armed Forces, United States Armed Forces Reserves, the Virginia National Guard, or the Virginia National Guard Reserves. Armed conflict includes military operations against terrorism or as the result of a terrorist act, a peace-keeping mission, or any armed conflict after December 6, 1941. This program may pay for tuition of fee at any state-supported college or university in Virginia. Benefits are available for up to four years.

FREEDOM TEAM SALUTE AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

At our next monthly meeting, Mr. Greg Raines, will present information on the Freedom Team Salute Ambassador Program. It seems from looking on the internet, that the general mission of Freedom Team Salute is to strengthen the Army community by honoring veterans for their service and dedication to the U.S. Army and by providing Soldiers – Active, Guard, and Reserve – the opportunity to recognize those who support them. Through a simple nomination process, FTS allows all Army veterans to receive an FTS Commendation package, and provides active duty, Army National Guard and Army Reserve Soldiers the opportunity to nominate their parents and spouses for a Commendation. Guard and Reserve Soldiers can also nominate their employers. FTS Commendations include a certificate of appreciation and personalized letter of thanks from the Secretary of the Army and Army Chief of Staff, in addition to an official U.S. Army pin. Freedom Team Salute is an official program sponsored by the Secretary of the Army and the Army Chief of Staff. VIETNAM MOMENTS

Even in wartime, there are places you visit that stand out over the years.

In October of 1970 I was sending radio teletype messages for the Army's 525th Military Intelligence Unit. We were strung out all over Vietnam. I was part of a four man unit in Phan Thiet, a fishing village on the central coast where Ho Chi Minh had once taught school.

We received orders to tear down our post (which consisted of a large shack with a corrugated metal roof and tons of sandbags). Our tiny unit was being transferred to a city called Dalat in the very highest part of the Central Highlands.

In fact Dalat was at an elevation of 5,000 feet and we were told it had snowed there in 1966. Two of us took most of our radio gear and got aboard a helicopter for the long ride. We flew over miles of jungle which soon became green mountains encased in clouds and mist. If there is a "Shangri La" in Vietnam, this is it!

This beautiful city in the clouds was virtually untouched by war. The central square was jammed with French taxicabs from the 50's. Along the big city hill were large and small mansions and a huge hotel. A perfectly clear lake sat at the base of the hotel and off to the side was an "Esso" gas station with plenty of Mercedes limousines pulling in to fill up. The people inside those vehicles were well dressed too.

In the evenings (which were very chilly), there were hot chestnuts being sold as gorgeous women strolled the streets in their flowing Ao Dai's. Instead of the usual smell of fish oil, there was the aroma of spices and the good food being cooked at dozens of outdoor stands. This wasn't the war! We almost felt guilty being there.

I wasn't there long. After helping set up our radio net station I was quickly transferred to Qui Nhon, back on the coast of the South China Sea, where I spent the next 10 months. But the memories of Dalat are still with me today. A true fairy tale type place in the midst of an ugly war. Did anyone else pass thru this place? Write and tell me, please. I want to make sure it wasn't all a mirage or the product of a faulty memory of an aging vet.

VOICE OF DEMOCRACY - PATRIOTS PEN - TEACHER CONTESTS

The VFW school speech and essay contests have a November 1st deadline.

The **Patriot's Pen** essay theme for 2008-2009 is "*Why America's Veterans Should Be Honored.*" The length of the essay should be 300-400 words. Students in Grades 6 thru 8 are eligible.

The **Voice of Democracy** speech and essay theme for 2008-2009 is "*Service and Sacrifice by America's Veterans Benefit Today's Youth by.....*" A 3-5 minute essay recorded on a standard cassette or CD is required. Students in Grades 9 thru 12 are eligible.

The VFW also recognizes the nation's best teachers with its **National Citizenship Education Teacher Award.** There are three categories: Grades K-5, Grades 6-8 and Grades 9-12. Any teacher who emphasizes community service, patriotism and good government and citizenship in their classrooms is eligible.

One important point to make is that students do not have to enter thru their school but can enter by submitting their work directly to VFW posts by the deadline date.

GLEN GARDINER ELECTED NEW VFW NATIONAL COMMANDER

ORLANDO, Fla., Aug. 21, 2008—America's largest organization of combat veterans has elected a Vietnam War veteran to head the 1.6 million-member Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

Glen Gardner, a resident of Round Rock, Texas, was elected national commander August 21 during the VFW's national convention, held August 16-21 in Orlando, Fla. Gardner is the fourth Texan to head the 109-year-old veterans' service organization.

In his acceptance speech, Gardner, who served in the Marine Corps from 1966-1970, reminded the mostly Vietnam-era audience that to remain a vibrant organization, the VFW must be attractive to today's generation of military service men and women, so they can assume more leadership roles within the organization at the local level. -- **VFW.org**

BILLS HELP TRANSITION TO SCHOOL, CAREERS

Washington, DC - Late last night, the U.S. House of Representatives approved two bills introduced by the Chair of the Veterans' Affairs Subcommittee on Economic Opportunity, Stephanie Herseth Sandlin: "The Pilot College Work Study Programs for Veterans Act" and the "Improving SCRA and USERRA Protections Act." Both bills will help ease the transition of men and women who have served in uniform into civilian life following their service to their country.

The bills reflect input and testimony received at field hearings on transition assistance that the Subcommittee on Economic Opportunity has held across the country in the 110th Congress. <u>Rep. Herseth Sandlin</u> said "These bills address issues raised at field hearings across the country, including in South Dakota, where the committee heard first-hand accounts of the challenges veterans face." Earlier this week, Rep. Herseth Sandlin held a field hearing of her subcommittee in Rapid City, to discuss similar Transition Assistance Program issues and gather testimony from South Dakota service members.

Currently, veterans utilizing their <u>GI Bill benefits</u> who qualify for work-study may only hold positions related to VA work. H.R. 6224, the "Pilot College Work Study Programs for Veterans Act," directs the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to conduct a five-year pilot project to test the feasibility of expanding qualifying work-study activities to include positions in academic departments such as tutoring or assisting with researching, teaching and lab work as well as student services such as positions in career centers, financial aid, orientation, cashiers, admissions, records and registration offices.

The second bill introduced by Rep. Herseth Sandlin, which passed the full House or Representatives, was H.R. 6225, the "Improving <u>SCRA</u> and <u>USERRA</u> Protections Act." Rep. Herseth Sandlin introduced this bill to help protect veterans from losing their jobs due to military service. The legislation is in response to a court case surrounding the plight of Dr. Carlos Bedrossian, who, in addition to his military service in the Air Force Reserves, was employed as a physician and professor at Northwestern Memorial Hospital. The Hospital sought to fire Dr. Bedrossian because of the inconvenience caused by his military service.

"As Chair of the Veterans Affairs Economic Opportunity Subcommittee, one of my top priorities in Congress is ensuring that our veterans receive fair treatment and the benefits they were promised upon completion of their service to their country," Rep. Herseth Sandlin said. "The bills we passed in the House this week take important steps toward this goal. I appreciate the support of my colleagues and I would urge the Senate and President to act quickly as we work to keep our country's promises to the men and women who have bravely served and sacrificed."

VA DELIVERING CARE "OUTSIDE THE BOX""

"The American Veteran" Reports on High Tech and Stimulating Surf

WASHINGTON – Using the latest high tech devices as well as the energy of wind and waves, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is helping veterans make health care and health maintenance parts of their everyday routine -- a story which is a highlight of the August edition of "The American Veteran," the Department's monthly half-hour news magazine.

"VA brings together the best minds and hearts in many professions to help veterans reclaim their place in the world," said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Dr. James B. Peake. "These stories spotlight the deep reserve of healing within veterans and their desire to embrace life head on."

The top story highlights VA's home telehealth program, where over 30,000 veterans are able to check into their medical center daily without ever leaving home. By entering information into a home monitoring system, data is transmitted instantly to their medical center using standard phone lines.

A second feature takes viewers to the beaches of Malibu, where veterans experience sun and surf in a uniquely California form of physical and mental therapy -- on a surfboard. All of the participants in this surf workshop are disabled veterans.

There are still some things that can be done only in the hospital, but are being done more quickly and accurately than ever before. In Loma Linda, Calif., a cardiologist is using the latest Cardiac CT scan technology to diagnose potential heart disease. Using this sophisticated equipment, thousands of two-dimensional images are used to create an interactive 3-D model of the patient's heart.

The series is designed to inform active-duty members, veterans, their families and communities about the services and benefits they have earned and to honor them. VA's Office of Public Affairs and the VA Learning University / Employee Education System (VALU/EES) produce the program and broadcast it to VA facilities around the world on The Pentagon Channel and to community cable outlets.

Aimed at veterans of all eras, VA also tells stories of heroism and sacrifice, and relives moments in history with those who were there, reminding veterans of the bond of service they share.

VA's Office of Public Affairs offers the program to local broadcasters and cable outlets and makes it available for viewing on the VA Web site, <u>www.va.gov</u>. The Salem VA Medical Center is also located next door for additional services for those qualified.

Additionally, the building and grounds offer an array of amenities to include wheelchair accessible nature trails and deck, library, chapel, barber shop, billiard room, wood working shop, and convenience store. The facility is nestled in the landscape of the Blue Ridge mountainside and has been enjoyed by our veterans since it was opened on Veterans Day, 1992. -- **Military.com—Benefits**

ADOPT-A-UNIT
