#### **VFW School Visit**

4 members of VFW Post 7589 made the trip to Mayfield Intermediate School in Manassas last Veterans Day week to speak to students in the fifth and sixth grade. Ron Link and I are Vietnam Vets, Mike Guttman is a veteran of the continuing war in Iraq and Joe Dazzo took part in three major landings in World War Two.

Ron and Mike spoke to a class in the morning, Joe and I spoke to another class in the afternoon. I was going to bring a crossbow with arrows I had purchased at a Montagnard village in the Central Highlands then suddenly realized bringing a weapon into a school these days would earn me a trip to the Manassas jail. Joe was smart. He brought pictures of Hitler as an audio visual aid. So I dug out my old Army uniform and brought that.

Ms. Cyndy Mattia, a former VFW teacher of the year, was involved so these young students were well prepared. As a former teacher myself, I expected a very short attention span as we told our "war stories." But there was a surprise! Most of these students were really interested. They were especially fascinated by the trip thru History that Joe was able to give them. If you want the unvarnished truth, speak to a young person. They will give it to you straight minus any sugar coating. "Mr. MacLeod, what about drug use among soldiers in Vietnam?" "Mr Dazzo, did you meet Hitler?" "Mr MacLeod, how come we lost?" "Mr Dazzo, why did we let the Russians take part of Berlin?" Be ready for tough, but informed questions at all times.

But the real surprise came later. The students wrote thank you notes to all of us. We'll always keep these, they're so representative of the vast majority of really good young people in our schools today.

Damien Thomas wrote: "You guys are my heroes and inspiration, it makes me want to research the military. Have a Happy Veterans Day!" Austin wrote, "thanks for your wonderful stories about the war you have been in. You made history awesome." Austin's note was accompanied by a picture of a guy waving from a tank. Corey wrote this: "I am going to take all your influence and join the Air Force." His card had photos of returning Iraq War Vets and another picture of soldiers disembarking from a landing craft on D-Day (he must have been paying attention to Joe).

You get the idea. Its rewarding to speak to students about your experiences. If anyone would like to become involved in speaking to students in our Manassas area schools, please let me know.
