Recognizing the Tuskegee Airmen with Top Gun honor 73 years after winning



Members of the Tuskegee Airmen are some of the most highly decorated military pilots in U.S. history. But there was one honor that was overlooked for more than 70 years — until now.

In 1949, a team from the famed all-Black Tuskegee Airmen won the first Top Gun contest, a gunnery competition among pilots from across the Air Force. But the record book listed the winner as "unknown."

The trophy "mysteriously got lost", until 2005, when a historian found it in storage at an Air Force Museum. "She asked, 'Why isn't this on display?' And was told, 'We can't display everything, but this item will never be on display.".

The trophy is now on display, and last week a plaque commemorating the first Top Guns was unveiled at Nellis Air Force Base in Nevada, where the original competition was held.

The 66th Air Force Flying School was opened at the historically black college Tuskegee Institute (today Tuskegee University) in Alabama. The flying school opened as an experimental training ground to test the potential of black pilots. "It was programmed to fail," in support of findings in a 1920s War Department report stating that blacks weren't smart enough or disciplined enough to fly a plane.

# VFW Urges POTUS to Support Repeal of Concurrent Receipt Policy

VFW National Commander Tim Borland writes letter to the White House asking for leadership on the issue

WASHINGTON (Jan. 17, 2023) — In a letter sent to the White House, Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) National Commander Tim Borland urged President Biden to support the repeal of concurrent receipt policy, which denies veterans receiving both retirement pay and VA compensation if they were forced to retire early from military service because of battlefield injury or illness.

"I write to request your urgent support in ensuring our nation's veterans receive the benefits they have earned by defending the ideals our nation holds sacred," opened Borland in his letter addressing the policy. "This policy is nothing more than a way to save money on the backs of veterans."

As it stands the current compensation rule imposes what is known as an offset, requiring veterans forfeit all or part of one benefit to pay for or pay back another. Congress justifies the policy as a way to prevent veterans from "double-dipping" from the federal government, a justification which Borland says is erroneous.

"Military retirement pay is earned for years of vested service, while VA disability compensation is awarded as supplementary

incur lifelong illnesses and injuries from their service," wrote Borland. "These are two fundamentally different benefits earned for two entirely different reasons."

The Major Richard Star Act (H. R. 1282/S. 344), which would provide total offset relief to veterans who suffered combat injuries or illnesses who were medically retired with less than 20 years of service, garnered overwhelming bipartisan and bicameral support from members of the 117th Congress. Despite this, the bill did get enough votes to make it to the President's desk.

"It has become clear that political will is lacking, warranting the White House's leadership," wrote Borland. "The VFW—and by extension the entire veteran community—is looking to you, President Biden, to lead from the front on this issue."

The letter concluded by pressing the President to make repealing the concurrent receipt policy one of his legislative priorities in the fiscal year 2024 Department of Defense budget request.

"No veteran should question the value of their service to our country due to an unethical budget gimmick," wrote Borland. "By repealing concurrent receipt, you will let them know that Every Veteran Counts."

### Legislative Update — Virginia

**GREAT SUCCESS**. The following three bills passed the House Finance Committee:

**House Bill 1436:** Income tax; military benefits subtraction; age restriction. Removes the age 55 or older restriction on those individuals allowed a military benefits income tax subtraction beginning with taxable year 2023.

**House Bill 1470:** Real property tax; exempt for disabled veterans & surviving spouses.

**House Bill 2373:** Income Tax, State; Subtraction members of National Guard.

neering airmen practiced at Moton Field, a tiny airstrip surrounded by marshes and stands of pine near the institute founded by Booker T. Washington, the son of a slave who was a strong advocate for black rights

During their flight training, the airmen were denied rifles because the airstrip was in Alabama, a deeply segregated state where some folks didn't like the idea of blacks shooting at whites --even if they were the enemy.

The drills became bittersweet to the airmen, whose hopes of flying dimmed as they waited and waited for a call-up from the government. After months of waiting, their spirits were restored by a visitor (Eleanor Roosevelt) to the airstrip.

"I've always heard colored people can't fly, but I see them flying around here," Eleanor Roosevelt reportedly said during her visit. Against the objections of her security men, the open-minded, free -spirited first lady asked to fly with Anderson.

Using her political connections, Roosevelt convinced her husband to use his influence to give the airmen a chance to fight --- especially since the military was facing a critical shortage of pilots.

The Tuskegee Airmen were a group of primarily Negro military pilots (fighter and bomber) and airmen who fought in World War II. They formed the 332d Expeditionary Operations Group and the 477th Bombardment Group of the United States Army Air Forces

The Tuskegee Airmen not only broke the color line but also shattered stereotypes about black pilots.


