

VFW Calls Phoenix VA System a Failure

After reports that at least 40 veterans have died while awaiting care in the Phoenix VA Healthcare System, VFW National Commander Bill Thien said there is zero trust in leadership's ability to lead, much less to properly care for America's heroes. Phoenix allegedly kept two sets of waiting lists, only one of which is official and used to report average patient appointment waiting times to Washington. The VA requires its

medical facilities to provide care to patients typically within 14 to 30 days, depending on the availability and specialty required. According to CNN's report, the alleged secret waiting list tracks real appointment waiting times, which span far beyond 14 to 30 days; precious time seriously ill patients cannot afford. "If the allegations of veterans dying as a result of this internal process are true, then the individuals responsible

should be prosecuted criminally to the fullest extent of the law," said Thien. "The Secretary of Veterans Affairs needs to fire them all, then let the lawyers sort it out." Read more at http://www.vfw.org/Newsand-Events/Articles/2014-Articles/ PHOENIX-VA-MEDICAL-SYSTEM-IS-FAILING-**VETERANS**/.
