Post Commander's Message



In Vietnam in 1970 and 1971, I was a Radio Teletype Operator (MOS: 05C20) for the U.S. Army's 525th Military Intelligence Unit. The 525th had small units strung out all across the country, in all four regions. Our "radio shack" was located in Qui Nhon in central Vietnam at the base of Vung Chua Mountain and just a stone's throw from the South China Sea. There were large North Vietnamese units in the area along with the local Viet Cong and many nights, they had control of huge swaths of the mountain. They

would set up and launch attacks on the American base below and the radar station on top of the mountain.

The 525th's intelligence agents would make daily contact with their Vietnamese agents who would slip inside and outside of enemy territory. We would get the reports, type them up on a crude early computer and send them, encrypted, to the rest of our radio net including Nha Trang, Tuy Hoa, Bong Son, An Khe, Ban Me Thout, and Pleiku. The most sensitive reports would go to Saigon and the U.S. Air Force and sometimes to the peace talks going on in Paris. Sometimes you would get 30 or 40 reports a day during periods of high activity.

Many reports I saw would mention "Western looking POWs" who would be paraded into the villages of Binh Dinh Province by the Viet Cong for "re-education classes" for the villagers. There was a tall blond guy who kept showing up in the reports. These prisoners would always be heavily guarded with their hands tied behind their backs according to the intelligence reports. I wish I had a dramatic rescue story for you here but the truth is I never found out what happened to these guys and no rescue mission was ever launched that I know of. All I know is that when all the POWs were released in early 1973, there were only a handful from South Vietnam. Most of the freed prisoners were American pilots who had been held in North Vietnam. Naturally I kept looking for a tall blond guy, who had been held in the south, but never saw him on the TV news reports of the time.


Because of this experience, and others, I have always been sensitive to efforts to find missing Americans from our nation's wars. Just think of the families of these military guys who just disappeared in the fighting. If you receive and read the VFW's "Action Corps Weekly" (sent to your computer) you will discover regular news of the remains of military men from World War Two, Korea and Vietnam being found. Just this past week there was news of the identification of the remains of an 18 year old Army Sgt. from Waterford, Conn. Like so many, he was lost when China sent hordes of soldiers against surprised and outnumbered American forces near the Chosin River in what is today North Korea. This happened back in November and December of 1950. At least now his family finally has closure after 66 years!

There is still a lot of work left to be done. The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, part of the U.S. Defense Department, still lists nearly 83,000 missing U.S. military personnel from our nation's wars starting with World War Two. In fact, 75 percent of that number are listed as missing in the Asia-Pacific area. More than 41,000 of the 83,000 are presumed lost at sea. There are still 1,618 missing from the Vietnam War and 7,802 missing from the Korean War. Most of the 83,000 missing are from World War Two.

Efforts continue to find them. Our Post supports the efforts of Kuentai USA, a Japanese/American effort to find the remains of Japanese and American soldiers from the fierce fighting on the Pacific islands in World War Two. You can read a very interesting article in the September VFW magazine about efforts by the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, especially at its lab at Offutt Air Force Base in Nebraska, to identify remains.

I think the most important thing we can do is never to forget. On Friday, September 16 at 8:00 pm, we have been invited to American Legion Post 10 in Manassas to participate in a ceremony on "National POW/MIA Remembrance Day." Post 10's Commander Rebeccah Christovich says you might be asked to march in with a flag. Sounds good to me. Our own Merle Hancock, a former World War Two prisoner of war, was honored and spoke at that ceremony last year. The motto of the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency is "Fulfilling Our Nation's Promise" to bring everyone home!

Library of Congress GAZETTE August 6, 2016

The Library of Congress, which holds the largest multi-format collection of materials on the American experience in World War I, will present a major exhibition in 2017 to commemorate the centennial of The Great War.

The United States' involvement in the "war to end all wars" began April 6, 1917, when Congress formally declared war on the German Empire, and concluded Nov. 11, 1918, with the armistice agreement. The exhibition will examine the upheaval of world war, as Americans experienced it, domestically and overseas. The exhibition, in the Jefferson Building, will open in early April 2017 and close in January 2019. Initially, it will feature 200 items, but during its 18-month run, numerous other artifacts will be rotated into the display.

World War I, at the time, was the greatest conflict the world had ever known. It created seismic changes in American society and

reshaped the global community in profound ways. In the United States, a national army was conscripted for the first time; more than a million women entered the workforce, contributing to the war effort in countless ways; and African-Americans challenged racial inequality. The first widespread use of airplanes, tanks and poisonous gas revolutionized warfare and technologies; the wristwatch was popularized by the demands of modern battle; and jazz spread around the world with the American soldiers going abroad.

The exhibition will feature correspondence, music, film, recorded sound, diaries, posters, photographs, scrapbooks, medals, maps and various other artifacts from the war. The collections of the Veterans History Project will be interwoven throughout the exhibition to give voice to those who served.

Now through April 2017, the Library is featuring twice-monthly blog posts about World War I, written by Library curators who highlight stories and collection materials they think are most revealing about the war. The posts can be viewed at www.loc.gov/blogs/.




On August 16th we received our largest single donation of aluminum can tabs - estimated at 60,000. The tabs were collected by the Independence which assists and coordinates local programs to pro-

VA Adds New Women's Chat Service:

The VA's Women Veterans Call Center is expanding its outreach to women veterans with a new online, one-to-one chat function. The new service enables women veterans to go online and anonymously chat via real-time text messaging with trained representatives, all of whom are women and many of whom are veterans themselves. The new chat feature, which is open extended hours Monday through Saturday, provides another avenue for women veterans to ask general questions about benefits, eligibility and services specifically related to them. Help with Health Care Billing Issues:

VA has established a toll-free phone number for veterans to call if private sector health care providers have improperly billed them for care that VA is required to pay. The VFW urges any veteran being pursued by collection agencies to seek VA's assistance. VA will help you resolve adverse credit reporting and debt collection issues. Veterans who believe they have been incorrectly billed for their care should also call the billing call center to



determine if VA is liable for the cost of the care. For assistance, call 1-877-881-7618 and press 1, from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Eastern Time.

Expanding Online Exchange Shopping Access:

Military Times is reporting that the Defense Department's Executive Resale Board is recommending that all honorably discharged veterans be authorized to shop online through military exchange store websites. The VFW-supported idea was first pitched two years ago by the Army & Air Force Exchange Service as a way to increase donations to respective service morale, welfare and recreation programs, as well as to thank the great majority of honorably discharged veterans who do not make the military a career. If approved, the new benefit would apply to online shopping only, not at traditional brick-and-mortar stores, where access will remain restricted to military ID card carrying service members, retirees, 100 percent disabled veterans, and their eligible family members.


